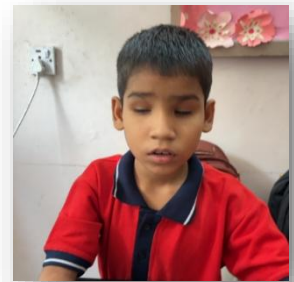

Computer Training:

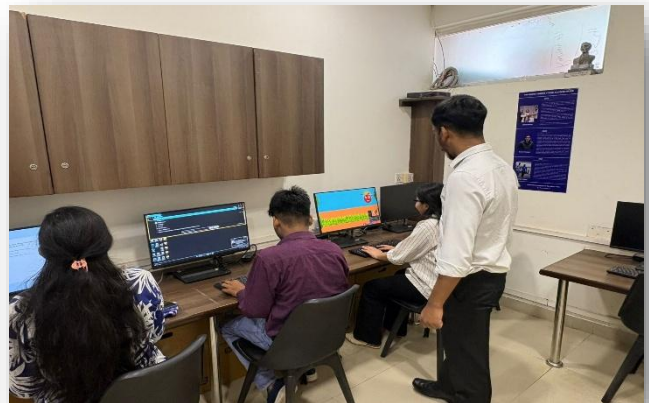
