### Session on Epilepsy and Seizures for Special Educators



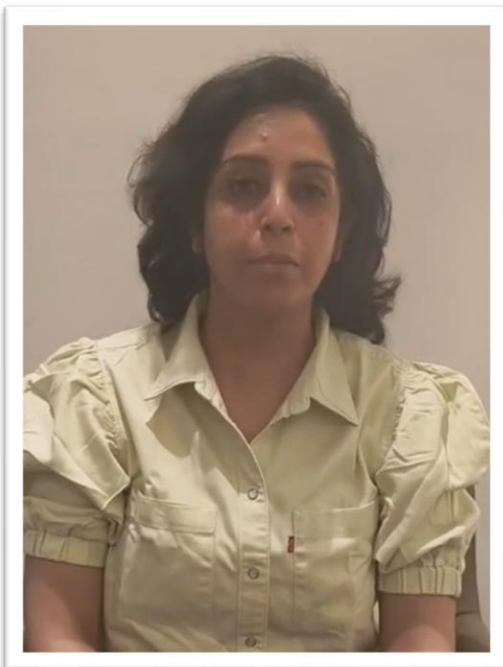
